##### Commentary

Up at 3am, and took the levothyroxine, and so time time to wait before taking calcium rich milk. So headed for the car with breakfast packed, the skies dark. Headed to the HQ, in the still air, but as Malmesbury approach and low lying mist with patchy fog was in the air. Clearly land lying and only a few meters thick, should clear in the morning sun. And so the HQ was opened just before 5am, light in the sky and some hope of a good day. Unpacked, and breakfast eaten – and thats how many of you found me – muching my way through breakfast.

The WTTA 100 has over the years been pushed from the DC to more rural SC roads. This year I had hoped the changes had settled, but with temporary traffic lights we had a last minute change which cut off a corner, and meant remeasuring and updated Risk Assessment. All had been achieved before the event, marshals had come forward. The game was on.

I was grateful, and surprised, to see an increased entry this year, many of last years riders (who surely knew what lay ahead) had enetered again; and many new, out of district, riders; and many triathleates.

And so to the race, well on paper it looked close between #60 and #50; but with Matt Burden in the form he is – and he was clearly the man to beat. From the off, he pulled ahead of all others, taking time out of all comers on every lap. So when on the final circuit he didn't appear as expected, and we heard of his accident; so we wouldn't know if he would break his time of last year – but this meant the race was on, between many.

My money was on David Janes, from his time on the entry form, he probably shouldn't have been on a zero – but his form said that he would be in for the win. And a good ride he did, but not enough to win.

The other zero, Rich Hunt – had started well (look at his lap placings) but blew badly on later laps – it was his first time on the U86 roads. Did the endless rolling landscape get the better of him?

And so the unexpected happened, Tony Champman, not fastest on any loop – but consistent through the event, went on to record the fastest time and win the event. It put a smile on my face, Tony is often up in the top 5 of an event, but rarely wins – but this time was one of those times. The quality of his ride, can also be seen that he was the highest plus on standard amongst the vet riders, but with one prize per rider – and the prize on standard flows down to Rich Hunt.

Third place on standard went down to Robert Gilmour, and this brings out a feature that I like about the new standard times, in this event, as in most, the largest numbers of vet riders are in their 40s – with less riders as age progresses. The prizes on standard well reflect this distribution, with the older riders in with a chance for the win. However with vet40 riders also in with a good chance of the overall win, as in this event, one has to wonder if vet prizes should go down to 40 year olds?

Amongst the women, and on paper Hannah was going to be hard to beat, indeed I expect her to go out front on the road for some time. Hannah had been set off with the other women, at the front of the field – it was the only place to put them, to avoid the event spreading out too much on the road. Hannah though at the hot end though would go out front, the only question was for how long? Eventually the latter half of the field, the fast half, would come through and catch – but the question in my mind is would the 0s and 5s in the slower half catch Hannah. Well

Chris Broad-Drake had a good race, and caught Hannah only in the second lap. Not thought that this affected Hannah, she still was fastest woman by over 45 minutes!

Some words on the team prize – its a prize I really like giving. A club has to send many riders to the event, to be in with a chance, and often riders lower down in the club need to ride to be in with a chance of the club winning the team prize. So VC Walcot would have been hard to beat – had they had a 3<sup>rd</sup> rider, but with only two and they weren't in the competition.

Chippenham took this though to an extreme – and entered enough riders for two full teams. A clever ploy, but alas not enough to beat last years winners – Severn RC. Severn, even without Matt Burden riding for them, are still a formidable team – and they won by half an hour or so.

And so to thank the various people that made the event possible, the Boons and Mary Jane in particular. The Boons not only time keep the event, they keep track on how riders are doing, put out the signs, and collect them at the end, after the last rider passes. Mary Jane, the WTTA treasurer, does so much to keep the Association going, and for my 100 has the thankless task of manning the HQ, whilst riders are out on the course for hour after hour. Other people that helped, are drawn from the WTTA member clubs – and its getting harder to find such people, still the people found are those with long history and involvement in the sport and great understanding – and some of the best people you could ask for.
