Longstone Edge hill climb

Great Longstone – Wednesday 29th June 2022

Promoted by Peak Road Club and myHill Cycling.

DYKE BACK ON TOP BUT JUVENILES STEAL THE SHOW.

Nearly six years after his last hill climb victory, Chris Dyke returned to the top spot with a storming ride on Longstone Edge last Wednesday evening. Never has the maxim "form is temporary - class is permanent" been more apt, as Dyke reminded all of us that the top step of the local hill climbing podium isn't just the reserve for the likes of Messrs. Nickols, Kenway and the Team Lifting Gear massive.

Ever the modest competitor, Dyke showed surprise when he heard of his achievement, particularly as it came on the back of largely riding the bike 'for fun'. Dykes' clear victory could not have contrasted more than with the fight for the remaining slots on the podium. Iain Duffield, Nick Latimer and pre-race favourite, Ashley Wilcox, all having to squeeze on the second step with identical times of 4 minutes 56 seconds. Latimer did, however, have the consolation prize of setting a new veterans record. As much as the senior racing was an exciting affair, the evening very much belonged to the youngsters, with the juvenile competitors setting times which topped the record books and were nothing short of sensational.

The first record ride of the evening came from 8-year-old George Anthony who made light work of the climb in just 8 minutes 33 seconds. In setting this time, George also had the distinction of being the only competitor whose time matched his age!

Three minutes behind George in the starting order was 13-year-old Isaac Holwell who bothered the 6-minute barrier with a time of 6:02, and although this was not an individual record, he did help his Matlock CC team mates set a new juvenile team record, thus updating their own record from the previous year. Behind Holwell came Longstone regular, Roch Morgan who set his first time, as well as the evening's first time, under 6 minutes with a PB of 5:56.

After Morgan came a trio of youngsters who set times which caused the time keepers to check their watches – such was the quality. First came Matlock CC rider Emil Howell, stopping the clock at 5.20, before his team mate Harry Hudson appeared with 5.02 – an incredible 41 seconds faster than his 2021 time and an effort which matched Ryan Williams' juvenile record. Hudson was still catching his breath when, less than a minute later, Isaac Oliver riding for Sheffield Youth Cycling Team, flashed over the line just 4 minutes 55 seconds after leaving the starting gate, and in doing so usurped Williams and Hudson from the top of the record standings. Hudson, however, did have the consolation prize of setting a new record for a 14-year-old, and with one more year in the juvenile ranks his target for next year will clearly be 4:54!

After the flurry of the boy's record book being rewritten, the sole juvenile female – the indomitable Maia Howell – was not to be outshone. She breezed up the climb in 6 minutes 39 seconds and in doing so improved her PB by over 30 seconds and recorded her first 'sub-7'. Howell's time also set a new record for a 13-year-old girl as well as, for good measure, a new overall juvenile record. Howell's time would also prove to be the fastest female time for the entire evening. All in all, not a bad evenings' work

After the juvenile race, came the senior females, and before a pedal had been turned in anger the small field was already depleted by the non-appearance of Frances Owen who sent her apologies before the event. Nonetheless, the 4 remaining competitors put in quality performances, with the youngest of them – 17-year-old Lilja Raine – taking top spot with a new junior record of 7 minutes 25 seconds. Local hill climbing regular, Sonja Insley came in second place, ahead of world duathlon silver medalist, Yvonne Twelvetree, who added some world class gravitas to proceedings with her third-place performance.

Once the senior men's race got under way, it appeared that Isaac Oliver's time could well stand the test of time and be the fastest outright time of the evening. Brian Whiteley's effort of 5 minutes 45 seconds was the fastest from the first 12 senior riders. The 13th rider to start was James Russell who proved himself to be more Rapid than Richard Stoodley, as he reduced Stoodley's V60 record by 16 seconds to 6 minutes 37 seconds. Finally it was the 14th senior rider, Chris Dyke, who finally brought honour back to the seniors with his ride of 4 minutes 48 seconds. Dykes time did raise expectations of a sub 4.30 winning effort, but as it turned out the remaining three 'hitters' had to settle for joint third fastest overall with the aforementioned time of 4 minutes 56 seconds – just 1 second behind Isaac Oliver who may have left the event without outright victory, but he did leave with some notable scalps in his kit bag.

In amongst the battle for senior honours, the sole junior representative Ryan Williams may have lost his juvenile record 30 minutes previously, but he gained another with a PB performance of 5 minutes 1 second. William's time was a new record for a 16-year-old junior and tantalisingly close to the 5-minute barrier, something which he could clearly beat next year without the distraction of having GCSE exams to contend with.

With the racing done and the signs cleared away, it was time to reflect on another promotion which owes its success to so many people and organisations. The first thanks must go to **Great Longstone**Parish Council who once again put their full support behind the event. Having a closed road means that there is no age limit for competitors, and it was a wonderful spectacle to see so many youngsters taking part, so thanks go to the residents of Moor Road and the owners of Dale Farm for supporting the road closure and enabling so many young riders to take part.

The organisers are aware that the event does take place within private land, so many thanks are extended to **Stuart Fairfax** of Longstone Moor Farm for his support. Can I also extend thanks to **Robert Thornhill** who generously offered one of his paddocks for competitors parking again this year.

The only disappointment of the evening was the small number of competitors. Like many events this year we struggled with numbers, and we can only hope that the economic climate improves in due course and we will once again have 100+ competitors as in previous years.
