CTT Regulations & Recommendations:

No competitor shall be permitted to start either a Type A or Type B event unless such competitor has affixed to the rear of their machine a working rear red light, either flashing or constant, that is illuminated and in a position that is clearly visible to other road users.

No competitor shall be permitted to start either a Type A or Type B event unless such competitor has affixed to the front of their machine a working front white light, either flashing or constant, that is illuminated and in a position that is clearly visible to other road users.

All competitors must wear a properly affixed helmet which must be of hard/soft shell construction. Helmets should conform to a recognised Standard such as SNELL B95, ANSI Z90.4, AUS/NZS 2063:96, DIN 33-954, CPSC or EN 1078. It is the responsibility of the rider to: (a) Select a helmet that offers protection against head injury and does not restrict the rider's vision or hearing. (b) Ensure that the helmet is properly fitted, is undamaged and in good condition.

PLEASE NOTE - No helmet, no front light or no rear light = NO RIDE!!!!!!!

Riders who currently use an inhaler for medical reasons must register this fact with British Cycling to satisfy UCI, CTT and BC Anti-Doping Regulations. It is an offence for a competitor in any event to use or to have administered to him any proscribed substance that might affect his competitive performance. A rider receiving medical treatment, which could include a proscribed substance, must not compete in time trials

This is a Type A Event & as such sleeveless tops are not permitted, (Regulation 16); "sleeves shall be at least mid-upper arm in length".

It is less than half a mile from the HQ to the Start (takes approximately 2 minutes), please do not arrive at the start more than 5 minutes before your start time. It is the riders responsibility to know the course (although there will be plenty of signs and marshals to guide you).

No warming up on the course and no U-turns in sight of the start.

The road surface is rough in places, please be vigilant – no head-down riding!

Please be polite and courteous to all time keepers, marshals and helpers, they have given up their time, so that you can race.



Maisemore Village Hall (postcode GL2 8JE):

Enter Maisemore Village on the A417. Church Road is halfway up (or down) the hill. Turn into Church Road - the village hall is 200 yards up the road on the left.

HQ will be available from 0800hrs.

U72 Course Description:

Start at bus stop lay-by just before the speed de-restriction sign leaving Maisemore (grid reference 811212). Continue to Staunton, turning left at the mini roundabout. Continue on the A417 across the M50 junction and on to the first roundabout on the edge of Ledbury. Turn here (13.3 miles).

Retrace the route, turning right at the mini roundabout in Staunton (care).

Finish just beyond Hartmore School, south of Hartpury village, at the pull-in by a gate into the woods (grid reference 798234).



Dr. W.T. Henry Trophy (History):

Doctor Bill Henry joined the club in 1962, after a chance meeting with Lew Morris when he was on a club run in the Forest of Dean. Dr. Henry was a G.P. at Parkend in the Forest and along with his wife Vera and daughters Jill and Carol would make regular appearances on club runs. Bill and his family each had a Hetchins painted in West Ham Football Club's colours; the bikes were always immaculately maintained.

At least once a year the Henry's home would become a tea place where most active club members would make an effort to attend and enjoy the fantastic spread that would be laid before them. All the money charged for this would be donated to club funds.

Bill would regularly turn out to help or take part in club activities, riding the Three Cities (taking a racing bronze medal in 197I) and 25 and 50 mile time trials. He was also invited to provide medical care at some of the spring training camps in Majorca.

He became club president in 1971 and was so honoured to be given this position that he gave the club a trophy to be awarded to the winner of the Autumn 25 Mile time trial.

The 'Doc' also enjoyed motor bikes and in his later years he joined a motor cycle club. It was while on ride with his club in South Wales in 1986 that he had a stroke from which he never completely recovered. Despite this Bill and Vera remained cheerful and were good hosts to the club as a coffee stop in the Forest of Dean.

Bill died in 2009, he was 83.
